SUBJECT:

Arctic Program Review and Recommendations

The President has reviewed the report and recommendations of the Interagency Arctic Policy Group forwarded by the Chairman of the NSC Under Secretaries Committee on July 21, 1972 pursuant to NSDM 144.

The President has noted the progress by the Interagency Arctic Policy Group and has reaffirmed his desire that the United States actively develop and pursue programs for increasing bilateral and multilateral cooperation in the Arctic, particularly in the areas of scientific research, resource development, and environmental protection.

The President does not desire, however, that the United States undertake discussions at this time with the Soviet Union, Canada, and other countries with Arctic interests with the aim of promoting the establishment of a multinational Northlands and Arctic Cooperation Compact and the convening of an international conference to this end.
