Subject: Negotiations for Storage Rights in USEUCOM (U)

- 1. This is one of several actions resulting from implementation of your Project 112, "Evaluation of BW/CW Weapons," on which the Joint Chiefs of Staff responded by JCSM-367-61, dated 31 May 1961, subject: "Evaluation of B-C Weapons (U)". A Task Group Report on Project 112 subsequently was prepared by the Director of Defense Research and Engineering, portions of which were approved on 4 October 1961 by the Deputy Secretary of Defense.
- 2. One of the approved actions, associated with the chemical and biological munitions requirements reported on by JCSM-820-62, dated 26 October 1962, subject: "Requirements for Chemical and Biological Weapons," was that stockpiles of toxic munitions should be strategically positioned to support the operation plans of the commanders of unified and specified commands. To accomplish strategic positioning of these munitions it will be necessary to negotiate for toxic storage rights in the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), France, and Italy. The proposed storage sites are all located at existing storage locations under USEUCOM control since land acquisition is not considered practical. This will necessitate waiver of currently prescribed storage critéria as quantity-distance factors cannot be met in existing storage locations.
 - 3. A US stockpile of toxic chemical munitions for ground weapons, representing a token retaliatory capability, was established in the FRG during the second quarter of FY 1959. The storage of these munitions has never been the subject of formal US/FRG negotiations. It is considered desirable, therefore, that storage rights for these munitions be more firmly established by their inclusion in the proposed US/FRG negotiations.

4. The Joint Chiefs of Staff conclude that the requirements for toxic munitions storage rights contained in Appendices A and B hereto are an adequate basis for establishing, in coordination with the Services concerned, a position by the Department of Defense leading to State/Defense negotiations with the FRG, France, and Italy. It is recommended that your office take further action toward establishing a US position for these negotiations.
